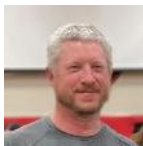

# Albany Independent Fair Board By-Laws

The Albany Independent Agriculture Society, also known as Albany Community Fair, Inc. These By-Laws adopted pursuant to Sec. 1711-02 of the Revised Code of Ohio.

**ARTICLE 1:** The object of this Society shall be to promote community interest in agriculture, art, industry, and other varied interests for the educational betterment of Alexander Local School District residents and the surrounding communities.

**ARTICLE 2:** Quorum – Those members at the meeting shall constitute a quorum unless otherwise provided by the statutes of the State of Ohio.

**ARTICLE 3: MEETINGS – Sec. 1.** The Board of Directors shall meet the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of each month at the Albany Fair Board Office.

Sec. 2 – Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by the President whenever necessary, or at the call of the Secretary upon written request signed by six (6) members of said Board.

## **ARTICLE 4**

### ORDER OF BUSINESS

2. Reading & approval or adoption of minutes

Order of business may be temporarily suspended at any meeting by a majority vote of a quorum present.

**ARTICLE 5:** The Board of Directors of the Albany Independent Agriculture Society may enact such Rules and Regulations, as they deem necessary for conducting the business of said Society which do not conflict with the Constitution or By-Laws, Regulations of the Ohio Department of Agriculture, or the Laws of the State of Ohio.

**ARTICLE 6:** If termination of the Albany Independent Agricultural Society should occur, then all assets would be dispersed in accordance with Rules and Regulations of the Ohio Department of Agriculture and Laws of the State of Ohio.



## Rules and Regulations

1. Any resident of the Alexander Local School District and adjacent Districts not to include Hocking, 18 years of age or older not active in Junior Fair as stated in Rule 15, may become a member by buying a membership ticket which will admit him or her each day or night of the fair and grant voting privileges.
2. Any member of the Albany Independent Agriculture Society on presenting his or her membership ticket and paying a small entry fee per entry may enter as many articles as space permits.
3. Tickets will be furnished by the Treasurer and Secretary or other designated board member.
4. All entries and entry fees shall be paid and entries in place according to specific times on page 3 of the current premium book. Entries shall be made in the name of bonafide owner or premium will not be awarded. When articles are not deemed worthy the judges will refuse to award a premium. All articles will be required to be on the grounds until 4:00pm on the last day. Any violation of this rule forfeits the premium.
5. Entries will positively be refused if not entered within the time mentioned and entry fee paid.
6. The Secretary's office on the fairgrounds will receive articles for exhibition if no one is at the booths.
7. All premiums not called for by November 1 of current year will be forfeited to the Albany Independent Fair.
8. All stock brought to the fairgrounds must be secured by halter or bridle. Positively no horses or bicycles on the midway.
9. If it be ascertained that any exhibitor has in any manner taken exception to the judgment of the judge, interfered by letter or otherwise with the judge, the Board of managers shall expel the exhibitor from completion for a premium.
10. All protests must be made in writing and filed with the Secretary by 12 noon of the last day of the fair with a \$25.00 deposit.
11. In case of unfavorable weather, thereby reducing display and attendance below an average fair-weather attendance and display, the premiums will be paid pro rata, after the expenses of running the fair and deducted.
12. The annual election of the Albany Independent Agriculture Society will be held at the Albany Fair Board Office at 3:00pm – 7:00pm on the first



Saturday in November, and a majority of membership assembled for such purposes and being 18 years old and holding membership tickets are eligible to vote.

13. Albany Independent Fair members must declare their candidacy for the office of a Director of the Board of Directors of the Albany Independent Fair by filing with the Secretary of the Albany Independent Fair a petition signed by ten or more members of the Albany Independent Fair who are residents of the Alexander Local School District and adjacent districts, not to include Hocking, at least seven days before the annual election of directors is held. Only regularly nominated candidates who have met filing requirements will be eligible for election as a director.
14. Each independent agriculture society shall confine sale of membership certificate to residents of the district specified in the constitution of said society. (Reg. AG.-3-01.02 -(B))
15. All exhibitors and participants must reside in or attend the Alexander School District and hold a youth membership.
16. Young men and women may participate and exhibit in the Junior Fair if over the age of 18, as long as they are still in high school or reside in the Alexander School District or have graduated from or resided in the Alexander School District and are still active in youth organization projects that have an extended finish date beyond the Albany Independent Agriculture Society dates, of current year.
17. All animals must be housed within the Alexander School District 30 days prior to the Albany Fair and all exhibitors must reside in or have attended the Alexander School District. Proof of ownership or lease and housing may be required.
18. Our fair will operate under the provisions of Ohio's Livestock Show Reform Act and under all applicable Ohio Department of Agriculture Administration Code Rules. This law and the amended rules may be viewed and secured at the secretary's office beginning the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday in June. Hours 6:00pm-9:00pm.
19. ROVING SOLICITATION. A. No person shall be permitted to make solicitations of any space. B. No person will be permitted to post or display signs, distribute handbills or advertising material, or sell or distribute free, any merchandise, except persons under contract. (Adopted by Albany Fair Board of Directors, April 15, 1981).



## Sunshine Law

**RULE 1:** Notice of all public meetings of the Albany Independent Agriculture Society shall be given in accordance with the following procedure.

- (A) Any person may determine (be informed of) the time and place of regularly scheduled meetings or the time, place and purpose of any special meetings by calling the secretary of the Albany Independent Agricultural Society.
- (B) Any person may obtain advance notice of all meetings at which any specific type of public business is to be discussed by identifying the type of public business for which he desires to be notified and by supplying the secretary of the Albany Independent Agricultural Society with stamped, self-addressed envelopes. The secretary will mail to such a person a notice of the time, place, and type of business to be discussed at the meeting at least four (4) calendar days before the meeting is scheduled unless the meeting is an emergency meeting.
- (C) The secretary of the Albany Independent Agriculture Society will maintain a list of representatives of the news media who have requested in writing notice of special or emergency meetings. The secretary shall mail such representatives notice at least four (4) days before special meetings or shall telephone notice at least twenty-four (24) hours before special meetings. In the event of an emergency meeting, the representatives of the news media who have requested notification of emergency meetings shall be notified immediately of the time, place and purpose of the meeting. The news media requesting notice pursuant to this paragraph shall supply the secretary with a name, mailing address, and telephone number of the representative to be contacted.

**RULE II:** Minutes of all meetings of the Albany Independent Agricultural Society will be promptly recorded and shall be open to public inspection at the office of the secretary by appointment.

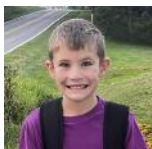

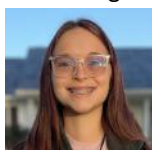

## Albany Independent Junior Fair Board Constitution

### MISSION STATEMENT

The Albany Independent Junior Fair Board will assist the Albany Independent Senior Fair Board in promoting the community of Albany. They will work



together to promote Albany's history and the welfare and exhibition of the talents of community members of the Alexander School District.

**ARTICLE I – Name of the Organization:** The organization shall be known as the Albany Junior Fair Board.

**ARTICLE II – Organization:** The members of this organization shall be charged with the responsibility and conducting of the Junior Division of activities at the Albany Fair under the supervision of the Albany Senior Fair Board. All activities planned will meet the approval of the Senior Fair Board. The Junior Fair Board Chair, who may be a member of the Senior Fair Board or an individual appointed by the President of the Senior Fair Board, will act as adult advisor.

**ARTICLE III – Object:** The object of this group shall be to promote the welfare of and exhibition of the Alexander School District youth who are in school. Section 1: Members shall wear provided Junior Fair shirts while present during the fair and other fair activities. If not in a provided shirt, members shall follow the same dress code as the Alexander School District.

**ARTICLE IV – Membership into the Albany Junior Fair Board:** Youth of the Alexander School District ages 9 to 18 may participate on the Junior Fair Board. Young men and women may participate on the Junior Fair Board if over age 18 as long as they are still in High School or graduates of Alexander High School and still active in youth organization projects of Alexander School District that have an extended finish date beyond the Albany Independent Agricultural Society dates of the current year. Youth membership passes shall be provided for the members of the Junior Fair Board. All members shall attend all meetings. Members shall attend a minimum of 5 meetings or events per school year (excluding Fair Week). If a member cannot attend a meeting/event, they shall inform the advisor beforehand. If a member does not meet the minimum requirements, they shall have their name placed before the Junior and Senior Fair Boards for discussion of removal from the board. Records of attendance will be kept.

**ARTICLE V – Selection of Members:** Junior Fair Board members may be chosen upon recommendation of the Senior Fair Board members, Junior Fair Chairman or current Junior Fair Board members, and must meet the approval of the Senior Fair Board.

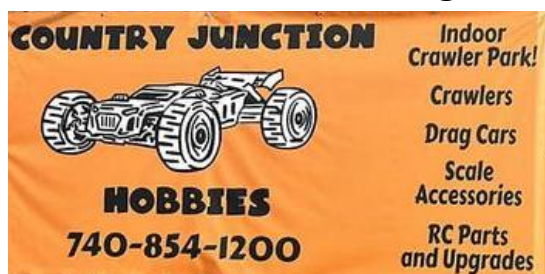

**RULES:**

1. All drivers must be able to start, stop and steer the tractor in a safe manner at all times. Driver must be able to disengage the clutch and drive the tractor without assistance.
2. The tractor must be a factory stock tractor.
3. Tractors must run stock RPM (4,000 RPM) and have a working governor.
4. The tire size will be no larger than 23 X 10.5 – 12.
5. Rims no wider than 10 inches.
6. Turf tires will be allowed.
7. NO cut or sharpened tires, chains or duals.
8. Drawbar height will be 12" from the ground to the point of hookup.
9. The track will be marked out 15 feet wide. If the tractor touches the lines, the pull will stop there and be measured at that point,
10. The track judge will stop any tractor if the front end gets too high or if any other dangers occur.
11. Any weight added must be secured in some way and cannot extend more than 12 inches in front of the tractor.
12. Tractor seats must have a back at least 3 inches tall.
13. If any rule changes or additions need to be made, they will be made at the drivers meeting and the Judges' decision will be FINAL.
14. WHEELIE BARS ARE MANDATORY.
15. Tractor must have a stock wheelbase and must have a stock frame, hood and grill for make and model of tractor.
16. NO LOCKED DIFFERENTIALS UNLESS FACTORY EQUIPPED.

4. The vehicle is allowed to have UP TO a 12-volt lawn mower battery, which cannot be mounted in the passenger seat and battery must be secured and sealed away from the child.
5. All doors and tailgates must be strapped shut. No sharp edges. Use zip ties or duct tape or other flexible products for making them stay shut.
6. Tires may be covered in duct tape to prevent them from breaking.
7. Motor must remain stock. The only modification you may use and will be allowed is using a lawn mower battery.
8. Decorative changes can be made to the Power Wheel to make it look like a derby car; however, there can be no reinforcement to the power wheel. Changes and additions are only decorative--example: header pipes sticking up, painting the car, etc.
9. At all times remember that this is for kids!
